We have been fortunate enough to have volunteers coming from Pierce, Kitsap and Mason County all with the desire to help take care of our community and its growing needs. Our volunteer program with sleeping quarters at the Robbins House makes it possible to provide coverage for our

district 24/7. This team carries varying certifications such as, but not limited to, Firefighters (interior/exterior structural and wildland), EMTs, IV Techs, Paramedics, Rope Rescue, SORT team, and more.

Our paramedic scholarship is in its third year with our first recipient having successfully completed her program. Our last recipient is about One Year into his program. Approximately 80% of our calls are EMS related.

screening and have a drivers license. We have weekly drills on Tuesday at 6:00 pm on varying topics. We move


trainings between the two stations, so call the station for more information and location of drill for the week.

We are excited for a BIG contribution to our department this year. Funds were donated to the Hood Canal Kiwanas with the specific purpose of funding a boat and training for our department. With so many bodies of water in our district, as well as surrounding districts, water emergencies can create challenges of getting the correct resources in a timely manner. This boat being built could make a huge difference and will make accessible the opportunity for a timely response for our district, as well as surrounding areas. We have plans to get it officially in service this Spring.






We are always looking for grant opportunities to help reduce costs to our voters, not only independently, but also working with other districts in Mason County. In the past we have been awarded through FEMA money to replace our expired SCBA's and more recently a grant through DNR to outfit three of our first out vehicles with updated computer capabilities. These systems will allow us to see commercial building layouts, hydrant location and the most recent data from dispatch when responding to emergencies.

Our first community CPR/ First Aid Class was hosted in June 2024 and had 7 people attend. While getting the certification may not be the priority for everyone, we would like to express the importance of high-quality CPR until responders get on scene.
